

Competitors in the horse events were able to participate in more events this year as the starting times of the rings were staggered so this could occur. Although the entries were down in this area, no doubt due to the fires in the area over the past months, competitors were very pleased with the condition of the ring. A big thank you must go to Russell Buckman and Ken Neven for this. Next year it is hoped that the new irrigation system will have been installed making this job a lot easier for all concerned.

The show was opened by Mayor Peter Beer of Snowy Monaro Regional Council who touched on the difficult times experienced by many in the area in the past few months and also commented that the district had certainly "punched above is weight" in staging the show. Council was again well represented with Councillor Bob Stewart, an information stand particularly focusing on weeds and other staff members also in attendance. The billy boiling competition returned this year to the delight of competitors and spectators, as did the dog jump that provided much entertainment prior to the BBQ tea that was followed by live music. With the night culminating in an impressive display of fireworks all present agreed that the show had been a great success.



### METING WITH CROSS BORDER COMMISSIONERS

On Thursday the 5th March, the Delegate Progress Association held their second meeting with the Cross Border Commissioners from NSW and Victoria. Contact was initiated with them some time ago, because of ongoing issues with cross border matters and they came to Delegate in November last year. At this meeting, there were members of the public present and naturally the main topic was the recent bush fires. Minutes were taken and a copy of the matters discussed were given to the Victorian Border Commissioner when he met at Bonang on the 10th March.

Matters Covered were:

- Centralisation of Fire Management causes problems.
- Lack of cohesive plan for evacuation
- More Controlled Burns needed
- Aircraft brought in early for fires which start in isolated areas, and upgrade to numbers of remote area fly in specialist fire crews.
- More co-operation between states where fires cross the border.
- Need for clearing each sides of timbered roads to prevent roads being closed for weeks due to fallen trees.
- Victorian residents who were evacuated had limited time to access allowance
- Victorian Fire App was much better than New South Wales which only showed fires in NSW. An App showing phantom fires caused annoyance.
- Discussions re better school bus services and cross border voting are ongoing.

Detailed reports will be forwarded to local members, both State and Federal.

## JACKAROO TRISTATE JAMBOREE TO BE HELD IN DELEGATE OVER EASTER

The population of Delegate will increase considerably over Easter, when 80 or more 4 wheel drive vehicles will stay at the Delegate Show and Sports Ground. The Show and Sportsground Committee will be catering for their Sunday night dinner. The recent fires has closed some of their planned drives, and caused a drop in the numbers attending, but there should be plenty of interesting drives which were not affected by fires.

It will be a big boost for Delegate's economy, and along with the popular Duck Race at Bill Jeffreys Park, will ensure the town is rocking over Easter.


The Street Planting should have been well and truly finished by then, so the town will have a new look.


### **RUGNY LEAGUE GAME ON AGAIN IN DELEGATE**

### THE CHANGING FACE OF DELEGATE'S STOCK AND STATION AGENTS.

Any important fixture in any Rural town in Australia is the local Stock and Station Agent and the first building to house this important institution is the "Old Mart" which stands at the Southern end of Bombala Street. Macarthur and Co. were the first proprietors, having opened in Bairnsdale in 1891 and a number of years later in Delegate. Then a change to Dalgety & Co in 1947, Dalgety NZ Loan in 1967, Dalgety Ltd. 1970, Dalgety, Winchcombe Carson 1979, Dalgety Farmers 1983, Wesfarmers Dalgety in 2000, Wesfarmers in 2001 and Landmark from around 2005 to 2019 are now Landmark Nutrien Ag Solutions in 2020.

## DAVID COTTRELL REMINISCENCES

David Cottrell who has been a resident in the Delegate Multi Purpose Service for several years was a long term member of the Commonwealth now Australian Federal Police from 1969 to 1998, during which time he was also served with Interpol. See below:

Dave joined the Commonwealth (now Australian Federal) Police in Canberra in 1969, he was posted to China in 1974 for one year with the opening of the first Australian Embassy there in Peking, his next posting was Cyprus, 1976 – 79, then Moscow in 1980. He was awarded a National Medal in 1987 and served with Interpol 1993 -98 in Canberra. He retired in 1998, returning home to Delegate and has been a Resident at the Delegate MPS for the last 11 years.


Lots of visitors coming for Easter this year. Gail Smallman is expecting her son and his wife who will be here to celebrate her birthday with her on the 11th. April.
